## A TRANSFER PLAN OUTLINE. For preparing to enroll at the University of New Mexico from another college or university AND pursue a bachelor's degree at UNM.

New Mexico public institutions of higher education each have a 31 hour General Education Curriculum (GEC) for associate and bachelor degrees; twenty two (22) hours are fixed, with nine (9) are flexible. Students transferring to UNM have three (3) options:

> OPTION 1 - Complete the entire General Education Curriculum (GEC) at any New Mexico public college or university. Courses that meet another NM public institution's GEC area will satisfy the same area(s) for purposes of a degree at UNM. Please consult your institution's list of approved general education courses to select the correct ones.
> OPTION 2 - Complete a portion of General Education Curriculum (GEC) of any New Mexico public college or university. Then, complete the remaining courses in areas listed below at UNM.
> OPTION 3 - Complete all of the General Education Curriculum (GEC) at UNM OR complete the equivalent courses in areas below at any New Mexico public college or university. Remember that the courses below are UNM-specific, so select courses at your other college/university in consultation with an academic adviser.

## STUDENT CHOICE - 6 credit hours

Two additional General Education courses chosen from two different Areas (1-7). Students who do not place into English 1120 may apply the credit hours from the prerequisite English 1110 (or the equivalent English 1110Y or English 1110Z) to help fulfill this requirement.

Foundation and Prerequisite Courses - These will vary by degree program at UNM and are important.
You may be able to take prerequsite and foundation courses prior to transferring--these are courses that are required for degree programs at the University of New Mexico, typically introductory courses. Check with the major you are interested in at www.unm.edu/academics/
